Dear Friends,

I want to give you another update on our Capital Campaign. Thanks to all of you, it continues to be a great success and we are close to our finish line. But, we still need your help!

We have successfully completed Phases I and II. If you remember, Phase I was restoring the exterior of our building. Two decorative windows were repaired, wood rot was removed and rebuilt, and all woodwork and gutters were repainted. It was a serious facelift, and it is such a joy to see our building look brighter from the outside. Phase II was interior work. We put in new hard surface floors in the narthex, Tower Room, Colonial Room, Founders Hall, and upstairs kitchenette. These new floors better fit the traditional look of our building and are



easier to clean in high traffic areas. We also improved our sound system throughout the building, with new speakers in the nursery, Fellowship Hall, and Founders Hall. We included a new soundboard and other updates in Founders Hall to improve our multimedia presentation capabilities.


Now, we are in the middle of Phase III – the sanctuary! Our chandeliers have been fully restored and rewired, and our recessed lighting has been replaced with LED fixtures. A ramp has been installed to make our chancel accessible to all God's people, regardless of mobility needs. This week we are starting on repairing the ceiling and walls, then adding a new coat of paint. Next up we have new carpet and pew covers. *Then* – we will be worshipping in our newly updated sanctuary! None of these changes will take away from the original look of our worship space but will only enhance its existing beauty. We have several weeks to go, but the end is in sight!

It has been a busy time for both the Capital Campaign Committee and Building and Grounds Committee. It has also been a very expensive time, as expected. I am so thankful to all of you for giving faithfully to the Capital Campaign and I encourage you to still remember us in your giving – particularly those who are still fulfilling their campaign pledges. Even once the work is complete, we will still need to be diligent in replenishing our Building Fund for whatever projects God has in store for us next!


The church isn't just a building, but our building is a major resource for our church. Thank you for your giving, care, and patience as we forge ahead into God's future for Trinity.





CHRISTIAN SYMBOL

CHI RHO - "Chi" and "rho" are the

first two letters in the Greek spelling for Christ (XPICTOC, pronounced "Christos"). The blending of these two letters into one symbol formed a "sacred monogram."



Early Christians created many such symvols as codes to indicate their discipleship while avoiding detection by Roman persecutors. Many variations of the Chi Rho symbol exist, incorporating a cross, a shepherd's crook, the Greek letters alpha and omega, an anchor and other images.
